A charitable society (located at the Victoria Disability Resource Centre) which offers blindness skills training in tactile skills: including Braille; orientation and travel training with the long white cane; daily living skills such as cooking; and technology such as computer and iPhone use without sight. Free of charge, to anyone experiencing vision loss. No medical referral is required. The instructors are blind, have a wealth of lived experience to share and promote a positive approach to blindness. Training is held in a class setting, enabling students to chat with their peers and discuss concerns with others who know what they are dealing with. Students are assessed and training is individualized according to each student's goals and abilities.

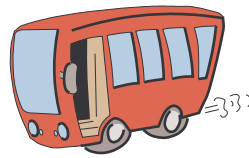

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## **BC Transit Information**

### **BC Transit 250-382-6161**

BC Transit offers a discounted monthly pass for passengers 65 years of age or older. The passes are \$45 and are available from bus pass vendors located throughout Greater Victoria.

The handyDART is a BC Transit service for people with permanent or temporary disabilities that prevent them from using fixed-route transit without assistance from another person. This custom transit service uses specially equipped vehicles and provides door-to-door service.

**Driver Safety**

**Driver Medical Fitness 250-387-7747 or 1-855-387-7747**

At age 80 and every two years thereafter, all B.C. drivers must have their physician complete a Driver's Medical Examination Report (DMER), which is then submitted to RoadSafetyBC. RoadSafetyBC will mail you information about this process prior to your 80th birthday. As your birthday approaches, you will then be mailed the DMER to take to your physician for completion. Drivers are responsible for the cost of having this DMER completed, and the fees vary by doctor. Depending on the medical information provided on the DMER, you may be required to submit additional medical information, or you may be referred to complete an Enhanced Road Assessment (ERA) to help determine your ability to drive safely. There is no fee charged to the driver for the ERA.

If you are presenting a Birth Certificate, proof of residency in BC is required. The BC Seniors discount applies only to the passenger fare. Note - the free fare is not applicable to all routes, however, a special discount on BC senior's passenger fares may apply to those routes. Persons with special needs may contact customer service to request assistance with boarding and disembarking.
